TRUSTEES



This year, women’s safety has been an even greater priority than ever before. Violence against women and girls (VAWG) continues to rise despite ongoing efforts to combat abuse. Minority ethnic women, particularly Muslim women, face unique and disproportionate challenges.

For instance, data indicates that domestic homicide rates are approximately 20% higher for minority ethnic women. Additionally, anti-Muslim hate crime and hostility, both online and offline, continue to escalate, as highlighted in our research report *Anti-Muslim Hate: Concerns and Experiences*. Our research on the experiences of minority women attempting to enter local politics also shows the persistent hostility and abuse they encounter.

Tackling misogyny and abuse against women and girls is a collective responsibility. Over the past year, we have engaged with the new government ministers, connected with diverse women’s groups, and expanded our outreach to a broad range of stakeholders, including those in the arts, culture, sports, and social media sectors, to explore collaborative solutions.

We are particularly proud to have launched the Amal Safety App, a vital resource that offers information, tools to document evidence, and direct access to our helpline. This milestone reflects our ongoing commitment to ensuring women’s safety and support.

Together, we must continue to work towards a future where all women and girls can live free from fear, violence and discrimination.



Case Study

A woman who was a spouse from Pakistan was controlled and abused by her husband and his family. She was not allowed outside unless she was chaperoned. She was made to do chores, not allowed friends, not allowed money and was not allowed to communicate with her family in Pakistan. After she gave birth, the family threatened to keep her baby and throw her out of the house. The MWN Helpline arranged for the woman to be rescued with her baby and placed in safe accommodation.

"Your support over the phone is the kindest care I have received since moving to the UK."

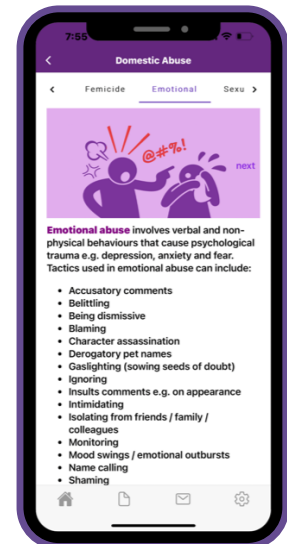

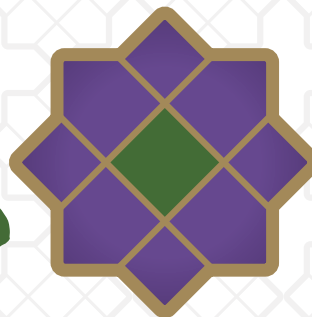

In response to growing concerns about the increasing normalisation of anti-Muslim bias in Britain, we developed the Muslim Heritage Month website and published it on 15th March 2024 to coincide with the UN International Day to Combat Islamophobia.

The project aims to:

- ✿ establish an annual tradition of celebrating and recognising the contributions and cultural richness of Muslims in Britain.
- ✿ challenge negative stereotypes, foster improved understanding, and cultivate greater empathy and inclusion towards Muslim communities.
- ✿ develop a centralised repository of information, bringing together a wealth of fantastic resources spanning the history of Muslims from the past to the present, particularly about Muslim history in Britain.

We will be involving organisations to mark Muslim Heritage Month in March 2025 and aim for it to become a tradition that is marked annually.

Muslim Family Law Project

MWNUK began a project with Dr. Rajnaara Akhtar from the University of Warwick (lead partner), which involves developing an information resource aimed at supporting Muslim families in navigating marriage and divorce, empowering them to make informed decisions.

RESEARCH



How will Muslim Women Vote in the 2024 General Elections? (June 2024)

This study investigated the voting intentions of Muslim women to understand the factors influencing their choices, their perceptions of major political parties and their ability to address Islamophobia.

85 Muslim women took part in the survey

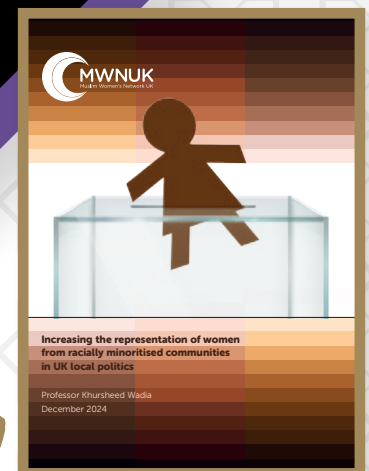

Women from racially minoritised communities in local politics (Dec 2024)

Only **3%** of local council seats are held by minority ethnic women - falling far short of the **9%** needed for proportional representation. The research examined the challenges that minoritised women encounter when trying to become a local councillor.

- 🌟 **27** aspiring, incumbent and former local councillors were interviewed.
- 🌟 The report made **15** recommendations to address on data, recruitment, rules, structural barriers and discrimination.



ADVOCACY

Women's Health Focus Group (Jan 2024)

A roundtable meeting was organised by the Cabinet Office Equality Hub / Department of Health in partnership with MWNUK, to find out about Muslim women's experiences of engaging with health professionals and what improvements could be made. The meeting with around 20 women took place in Birmingham on 26th January 2024.



UN VAWG Rapporteur Roundtable (Feb 2024)

UN VAWG Rapportuer, Reem Alsalem visited the UK to assess how well the UK government is doing to tackle violence against women and girls. MWNUK hosted a roundtable meetings in Birmingham on experiences of minority ethnic women of faith.

Annual MWNUK Event (Feb 2024)

We held our annual event in parliament on the 6th February 2024, which was attended by MPs and Peers from across the main political parties.



Muslim Women's Safety (June 2024)

MWNUK helped to facilitate a meeting in Birmingham's Yardley constituency with a group of Muslim women to discuss Muslim women's safety with Jess Phillips MP and Yvette Cooper MP. Muslim women expressed concerns about the rise in anti-Muslim hate crimes.



Maternity and Women's Health Team Away Day (April 2024)

Baroness Gohir spoke at the government Department of Health's Maternity and Women's Health Team Away Day about the work of MWNUK, domestic abuse, inequalities in maternity and women's health.

Muslim Women's Safety (Nov 2024)

MWNUK CEO Baroness Gohir met with Minister for Women and Equalities Anneliese Dodds and Minister for Faith and Communities Lord Wajid Khan. She raised concerns about gendered Islamophobia, hate crime and its under reporting, discrimination in the workplace and health inequalities such as poor maternity outcomes.

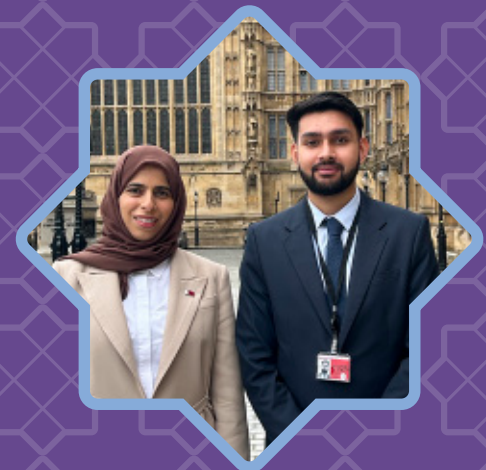
